### How to reach Fakir Mohan University, Balasore

The nearest Airports (both Biju Pattnaik Airport, Bhubaneswar and Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose International Airport, Kolkata) are at a road distance of 225 kms from the Fakir Mohan University, Balasore. The Balasore city is also well connected with both rail and road. It takes four hours from Bhubaneswar and also from Howrah to reach Balasore by train and most of the trains of East Coast Railway that terminates at Howrah run through Balasore Station. The conference venue at the New Campus of the University can be reached by hired taxi (half an hour journey) from Balasore town.
